This features meadow bugs, soldier beetles, spiders, caterpillars, shield bugs and even a surprise woodpecker! The content is suitable for all ages, but by special request I have tried to make this one particularly accessible for Reception and KS1. The content includes an introduction to minibeasts, and explanations of the differences between spiders and insects, and between beetles and bugs, as well as the concept that different species have different habitats. In a few weeks' time, when the meadow has developed a bit more, we'll be able to film some different species and go a bit deeper for KS2 children.
