18.01.21	History: Celtic Knot Drawing Celtic knots are usually created by endless circles or continuous lines. They are a mixture of straight lines and rounded edges. Have fun drawing your own Celtic knot.				
25.01.21	Geography: Create a PowerPoint or poster about both natural and man-made features in your local area.				
01.02.21	Science: Design and make an animal out of recyclable materials. Use recyclable materials where possible. Take a photo and attach to your assignment on TEAMS.				
08.02.21	Art: We've been looking at Eric Carle - author and Illustrator of many children's picture books. He uses paper collage to illustrate his books by painting and decorating his own assortment of cut paper. Try creating an animal using paper, painting, cutting and gluing.
