<p>Key achievements to date until July 2022:</p> <p>Smaller netball league but Oldfield won jointly with Courthouse having played 7 matches. Hi 5s team were placed 3rd in Ascot and Maidenhead Finals. A whole week of sports culminating in sports day and dance show for parents. Having won Maidenhead tournament, they represented MUFC at the Regional Finals in St Albans in football with U11 team. Tennis team won Ascot and Maidenhead finals and represented A&MSSP at the Berkshire School games in July. Year 4 girls retained Maidenhead X Country cup.</p> 	<p>Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:</p> <p>Our MUGA was finished in March 2023 and it has been used well but we will benefit from this more during the Autumn and Spring terms. It has provided not only extra useable space but real quality space. Still a need for more staff to help with OSH activities to maintain quality and quantity so not so dependent on a few and to add to the diversity of our offer although SENCo helped with New Age Kurling to provide more opportunities. Outside providers are running clubs with 50 pupils attending. All school-based clubs are very popular.</p> <p>Subject leader will be given time to undertake lesson observations/team teaching and able to provide effective feedback and lead discussions.</p> <p>Greater uptake in girls sport for those who prefer the opportunities of single sex participation. We have many teams and some at different levels but there are still girls who leave it until Year 6 to join in. We are hoping to bring this forward. Additional focus on KS1 starting with EYFS and maintaining progression throughout the school.</p>
