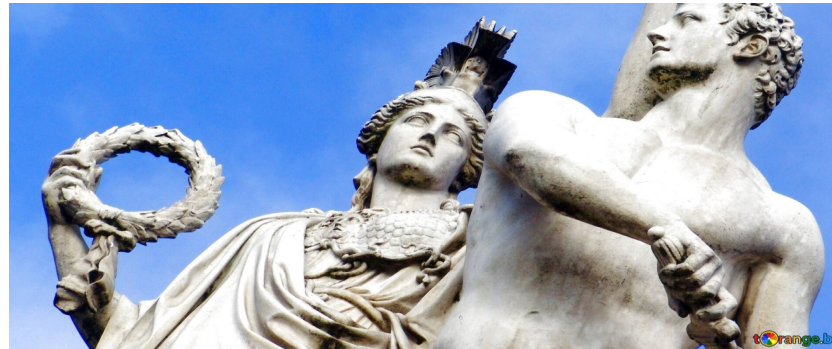


Knowledge Organiser — Year 4 Ancient Greece Life and achievements

Key Vocabulary

- Democracy : a system of government by the whole population or all the eligible members of a state, typically through elected representatives.
- Mount Olympus Was believed to be the home of the Ancient Greek gods.
- Athens The centre of the Ancient Greek world which went on to become the capital of modern Greece.
- Zeus .The king of the gods. He carried a firebolt.
- city state . Greece was split into separate groups called city states. They made their own rules, had their own laws and often clashed with each other.
- Temple The place of worship for the Ancient Greeks. Temples were often dedicated to one particular god.
- Myths The stories that the Ancient Greeks told about their gods. They often explained events or gave reasons for things happening in the world.
