Philosopher A thinker or someone with a theory

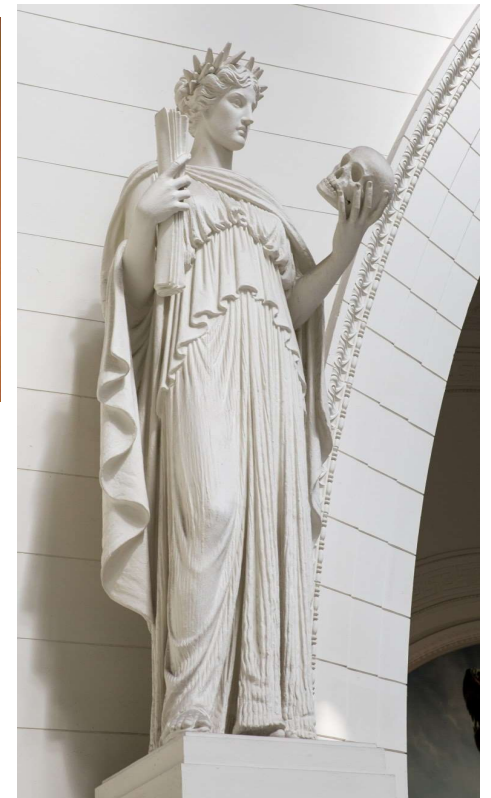
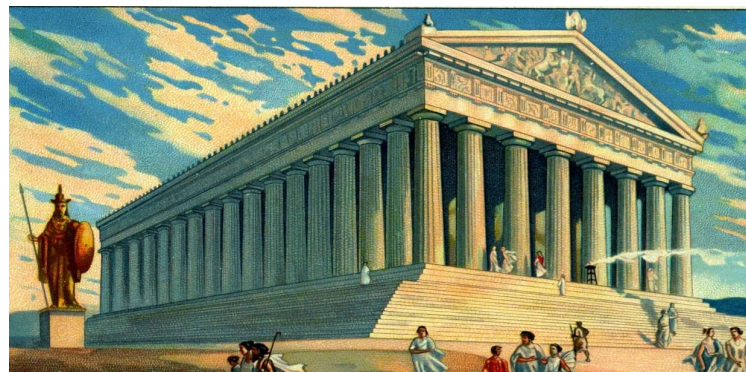
Sculpture The art of making three-dimensional representative or abstract forms, especially by carving stone or wood or by casting metal or plaster.

Alexander the Great The King of Macedonia, the ancient kingdom of Northern Greece, and the conqueror of the Persian Empire.

Temple The place of worship for the Ancient Greeks. Temples were often dedicated to one particular god.

Legacy The long-lasting impact of particular events, actions, etc. that took place in the past, or of a person's life.

Key Aim: To understand further the legacy left to us by the Ancient Greeks. To develop a growing awareness of chronological history.



We will learn how and why Greek architecture has been copied around the world, the legacy of great thinkers and scholars and how Alexander the Great expanded the Greek empire and the significance of this.
