Key vocabulary	
Evacuee	A person who is sent away from their home as it is too unsafe for them to stay.
Allied forces	Armies from different countries who are fighting on the same side in a war.
Winston Churchill	Prime Minister of the United Kingdom from 1940 to 1945, during the Second World War, and again from 1951 to 1955.
Adolf Hitler	A German politician who was the dictator of Germany from 1933 until his death in 1945. He rose to power as the leader of the Nazi Party .
Anderson shelter	A small pre-fabricated air-shelter that was built in the UK during WW2.
Doodlebugs	First 'flying bomb' invented by Germany. It looked like a small aeroplane and had no pilot.
Propaganda	Information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or point of view.
