

## Key Vocabulary

<b>Gunpowder Barrels</b>	Brown, round containers where gunpowder is kept. They are quite big and will make an explosion if it meets fire.
<b>Plot</b>	A plan (sometimes to do something to someone else).
<b>Plotters</b>	The people who come up with and try and do the plan.
<b>Guy Fawkes</b>	A man who was a plotter in charge of lighting the Gunpowder Barrels. Guy Fawkes was a Catholic Christian.
<b>Robert Catesby</b>	A man who was the main plotter in charge of the Gunpowder Plot. Robert Catesby was a Protestant Christian.
<b>King James I</b>	The King of England from 1603 to 1625. He was a Protestant Christian King.
<b>Parliament</b>	Parliament is an important place made up of lots of people who make important decisions for the people in England.
<b>Protestants</b>	People who are part of the Protestant Church, like King James I.
<b>Catholics</b>	People who are part of the Catholic Church, like Guy Fawkes and Robert Catesby.
